

Guide to Your Options after Mounts Bay Academy

Here is a summary of your choices after Year 11 2026:

1. Further Education College, School 6th Form, Independent Schools
2. Apprenticeship or Employment with Training
3. Army, RAF, Navy - Apprenticeships / Army College (with parental consent if U18)
4. Voluntary Work with Training

Consider how you learn best? If you enjoy an exam based style of learning such as A levels or if you would be suited to a mainly coursework based course such as BTEC Extended Diploma or a practical or creative skills based course learning something new.

Young people are required to stay in education or training until they are 18 but can consider a work-based option so long as there is some form of education or training linked to them.

YOU CAN APPLY TO ANY COLLEGE IN THE UK -

College Applications are completed in school in Jan 2025 in Tutor Time for local FE colleges. This is an online application. College Applications are usually live from October if students want to apply earlier but we advise plenty of time to research choices, attend open days and make the right choice. January they will also have mock results from November to support applications.

If applying for an independent school you will need to apply direct to the institution usually in the Autumn term. You may be eligible for a full or partial scholarship / bursary to help with funding costs



Qualifications you can consider After Year 11

A Levels – 2 year course (Level 3) – you choose 3 subjects (Academic)

Entry Requirements – Grade 6 in the 3 subjects you want to take at A Level and minimum 5 GCSE's at 5 and above to include English and Maths. You usually select 3 subjects.

Assessment is mainly by exams at the end of two years study. Suits students that enjoy exams and academic style of learning. Requires independent study so choose subjects that you are motivated to study outside of the classroom.. More competitive colleges will be looking for GCSE grades 7+.

T Levels – 2 year course (Level 3) – you choose 1 subject as a full time options (Vocational)

Entry requirements – 4 GCSE's grade 4 and above to include English and Maths and Science.

T Levels are two-year, technical programmes designed with employers, to give young people the skills that industries need. One T Level programme is the equivalent to 3 A levels. Taught full time in college and include an industry work placement for a minimum of 45 days. Will involve 80% at college and 20% in the workplace. Also welcomed by universities.

BTEC Extended Diploma - Level 3 qual – 2 year course – you choose 1 subject (Vocational)

Entry requirements – 4 GCSE's at grade 4 and above to include 4 in English or Maths

Equivalent to 3 full A Levels in value and full time course on its own. Assessment is combination of coursework, external written assessments, some exams and evaluation of practical skills. Students gain opportunity to gain employment skills as industry led. Progression can lead onto university (95% universities accept including Russell Group universities) or employment.

BTEC Extended Certificate Level 3 – 2 year course (Vocational)– can be combined with 2 A Levels

Equivalent to 1 A Level so needs to be combined with a range of other subjects. No exams, coursework based. Could be combined with other A Levels, or other vocational courses. Allows a more flexible, work based style of learning. After 1 year you complete Certificate course, after 2 years the Diploma course.

(IB) International Baccalaureate – 2 year course (Level 3) – you choose 6 subjects (Academic)

Entry requirements – 5 GCSE's grade 6 and above. Choice of 6 subjects. This qualification is suitable for students who are performing well in all their GCSE's. Maths, English, Science and MFL are mandatory along with 2 other subjects of your choice which could include Arts / Drama or another of the academics. Great opportunity for academic development. Keeps a wide range of options open, broadens your horizons. YP has to enjoy and be motivated to study.

Skills Based course / Progression Diploma—Level 1 or Level 2 – 1 x subject is Full Time option

Entry requirements – grade 2-3 at GCSE for L2 or grade 1-2 for Level 1. Practical style of learning. Learning new occupational skills in preparation for employment or introduction to vocational sector courses. Progression to next level Vocational course, employment or an apprenticeship.

Foundation Studies (Entry Level to Level 1) - A range of multi options vocational diploma courses from Entry Level to Level 1 available at all FE colleges. No entry qualifications required. All coursework based and can lead to further progression onto Vocational Diploma courses.

All Students will have to re-take their GCSE English and Maths at school or college if they do not achieve a grade 4 in their final GCSE exams.
